The summer programme worked out by the *International Cultural Centre in Kraków*, the *Institut für den Donauraum und Mitteleuropa/Vienna* and the *Institut für Internationale Beziehungen der Universität/Vienna* follows the last year's session on Galicia as a historic region of Europe. Galicia has been perceived in history as a powerful tradition which combines elements of plurality, cultural diversity, European identity and national revival. The idea of the cultural region goes far beyond the past and present ethnic, religious and state borders thus the idea of the summer session is to analyse the history, politics and future perspectives of the region from different points of view with special attention given to European integration process and the consequences of globalisation for Central European countries.

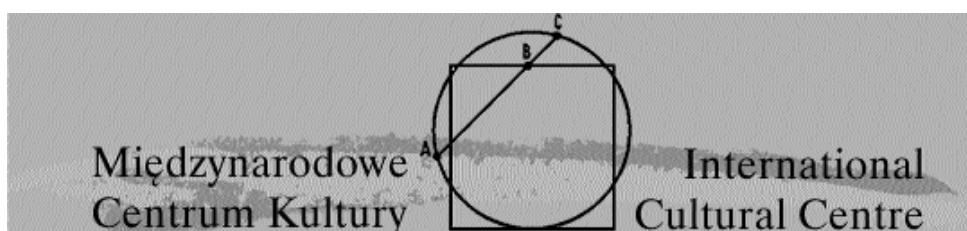
The curriculum will comprise lectures and discussions on such subjects as the history of Galicia, myths and identities, Jewish life in Central Europe, literary life, regional cooperation, European integration in relation to Poland and the Ukraine, economic and political transformation processes and identity.

The course will break the rule which has been applied until today, namely that one can take part in the programme of the College only once in his/her academic life. In 2002 we intend to invite mainly students who participated in the 2001 session, however new applicants are most welcome as well.

Dr. Emil Brix and Prof. Jacek Purchla are the programme's authors. The lectures will be conducted in English by experts, who have already cooperated with the ICC, among others: Alois Woldan (Passau), Shlomo Avinieri (Jerusalem), Jaroslav Hrycak (Lviv), Charles Ingrao (Purdue Univ./USA), Krzysztof Zamorski (Krakow). The course will end with a study tour around the eastern area of Galicia and will examine its urban and spatial development.

The session is addressed to advanced students, post graduates and young scholars who will gain credits after having completed written final exams.

Participants from Austria and Central European countries are offered scholarships to cover tuition, board and accommodation costs!
