In particular papers in comparative cultural studies are of interest, including in contexts such as holocaust literature and Central European culture and literature, although the editors welcome also textual analyses of Kertesz's œuvre.

Papers should be no longer than 6 000 words, in the MLA (Modern Language Association of America) style with parenthetical sources and works cited but without footnotes or end
